

OUTRIGGER CLUB AND UNIVERSITY PLACE MOST MEN

Trials For Rainbow Relays Draw Many Athletes; No Records Broken

The Outrigger club and the University of Hawaii paired off evenly in number of entries in the Rainbow Relay track meet trials held yesterday afternoon on Kam field. Both placed 14 men in the field events, 100 yard novice, and the hurdles. Palama came next with 14 entries, the Army fourth with nine, and the Y. M. C. A. fifth with four.

The 100 yard novice dash, in which competition was somewhat keener than in the 200 hurdles, was by far the better of the two trial races. French of the Army won the first heat in 10 1-5 seconds, running a very pretty race. Auld of the Outrigger won his heat, and Itoga, running for Palama, nosed out Walter "Buster" McGuire of the Outrigger in the third heat. Crozier took an easy first in the last heat, but his time was 10 2-5 seconds, slightly slower than that of French. It looks like French and Crozier will run an exciting race in the meet Saturday. Twelve men in all, three from each heat, qualified in this race.

Place in Hurdles

Ching and Eddie Fernandez of the University; Melim, McGuire and Crozier of the Outrigger club, and Lum of Palama, qualified in the 220 yard low hurdles. None of these, however, had to do any straining to place.

De Mello of Palama had his own way in two field events, the discus and shot-put. And it looks like he will run off with the bacon in these two in the final meet. In both he succeeded in nosing out Wriston of the University, who placed second. In the javelin, however, Lum of the Y. M. C. A., had a slight edge over De Mello, but the latter has a good chance of turning the tables Saturday.

Dick Gartley of the Outrigger took the initial place in the pole vault without much argument. Wicke of the Outrigger placing second.

The High Jump

In the high jump eight men were qualified, whereas in the other field events only five had been given that privilege. Eight men likewise placed in the broad jump. In the high jump Saturday the bar will probably be immediately set where it was when the trials were called off. The broad jump distance will probably be set along the same lines.

In the first heat of the 120 high hurdles, Whittle of the University and Correia of Palama ran a tie race for second place. Later these two ran it off and Whittle won. Gannon, whose excellence in high jumping stood him in good stead, won his heat in the 120 high hurdles after running a very good race.
