

Track And Field Stars Ready For Final Clash Of Year At Kam Field

403 Entries Filed With Otto Klum as Zero Hour Arrives; Mile Run With Hooper and Castanha Entered Causes Comment; Jack Scholtz Will Run

ENTRIES for the A.A.U. championship track and field meet closed yesterday with 403 athletes signed up for Saturday's closing competition. Otto Klum, chairman of the track and field committee, and B. H. Robbins, registration committee chairman, placed their approval on the individual blanks last night, and the program for the final exhibition of the season will go to the printers this morning.

Jackson Scholtz, world champion sprinter, and winner of the 200-meter championship at the 1924 Olympic Games, filed his blanks with the local committee yesterday and will run in the century and furlong events Saturday, and will attempt to break the records for the sprint events. Scholtz, who appeared in two exhibitions last Saturday at the Rainbow Relay carnival, is in fine shape and should take his events Saturday in fast time.

The entries which appear in detail below, herald the approach of several thrilling contests on the clinders and many more in the field events.

BATTLE LOOMS

The mile run, which will bring together two of Hawaii's greatest distance stars of all time, will be one of the big gate drawing events of the Saturday clash. Burt Hooper, Outrigger miller and island champion, will be pitted against Bill Castanha, present holder of the island record, established in the inter-scholastic meet this season, who is now challenging the champion for the crown. With Stone, Low, and Kaholwalua other entries in the mile run, the event will be, aside from those in which Scholtz is entered, the blue ribbon classic of the 1926 meet.

WATCH KAHLER

Kahler, lanky Army weight star, who smashed the discus record on four consecutive tries, is down again for another crack at the island mark, and a husky field will be present to make the Army champ extend himself to win. The other weight events, including the hammer throw, will feature an evenly matched bunch of athletes, many of whom will be down as favorites.

STARS RECOVER

Dick Gartley, Outrigger vaulter and champion of the islands, who was injured in the relay trials and who did not compete in the finals last Saturday, will be back in shape again, it is reliably reported, and will be on hand to defend his title against Correia and Andrade, who threatened his record last week. Carter, Luis, Gannon, Ault, Ching and Lemes are other pit stars who will be featured at the A. A. U. meet.

Bernard Farden and Dick Penhallow, Outrigger and Varsity respectively, who were unable to compete in the relays last week owing to pulled ligaments, have reported for practice again and may compete Saturday. Farden's presence in the century against Scholtz will be the incentive for many fans trooping out to Kam field to witness the A. A. U. championships.

INTEREST PICKS UP

After the showing of Army, Outrigger, Palama and Varsity in the Rainbow Rel carnival, interest in the coming meet has picked up, and opinions as to the winner of the championship clash are well divided, with the Pale holding a slight edge over the Deans and beach combers. Army, while boasting of many individual stars, hardly possesses the balance necessary to victory.
