

# Dope Gives Deans Edge In Competition At the Rainbow Relay Carnival

## Palama Settlement and Outrigger Canoe Club Teams Should Press University Crew; Expect Many Records To Fall; Deans Strong In Sprint Relays

The track activities of 1926—and also of 1925—have seen the upsets of the majority of its present favorites, with the result that singling out the likely winner of the Rainbow Relay Carnival for Saturday afternoon is a real hazardous task.

Everyone agrees that there will be a three-corner battle for the relay games title among the University of Hawaii, Palama Settlement and Outrigger Canoe Club, track speedsters. Of the three principal contenders, the University of Hawaii (last year's Rainbow champion) is given a hairline margin to win.

### Figured to Gain

The Varsity crew is figured to gain heavily in the sprint relays and strong in the field events with the exception of two numbers. As calculated, the students stand a very slim chance of scoring in the high jump and the polevault. The Pals look like point grabbers in every event and are predicted to romp off with the two mile and four mile stick passing races. The Beachcombers' medley quartet is apparently unbeatable and should set a difficult mark for the ambitious to crack. The boatmen are rated higher in the field department, having strength in every contest.

### In the Century

In the hundred yard novice the Manoa school has Gerdes, the speed demon, Billy Mountcastle and Willie Whittle. Gerdes has been credited with doing the century in 10 1-5 seconds. Coach Brash's Pals have enlisted the services of a great many prep luminaries, all who are capable of garnering some tallies. Such men as Henry Oana, Camara and Correira are in the Pals' lineup. Outrigger has Coleman and Cooke in this.

The Varsity's quartets in the quarter and half mile relays look invincible with Teddy Hair, Richard Penhallow, Pump Searle, Hung Wai Ching, Mountcastle, Giles, Gerdes, Eddie Fernandez, Thompson and Whittle to select from. In both of these relays, Outrigger and Palama have well balanced teams. The former has Bernard Farden, 100 yard champion, Raymond Melim, Charlie Cooke, Coleman, Wight and Harold Yap, while prep stars from the high school have been marshaled into the Pals' formation, including such men as Dolim of St. Louis, Tasaka and Waketake of McKinley and Luis.

The record for the mile relay is seemingly in a pretty dangerous position for the reason that the establishers of the mark, the University, have one of the most powerful four men teams in years. Save for Bruce Cruickshank, the past

season varsity relay team is intact. Billy Mountcastle, Eddie Fernandez and Henry Thompson are faster than ever. Ching, the well known broad jumper, will probably fill the breach, but this addition will not slow the squad as he has stepped out in fast time. The Palama crew has a good team for this event with Waketake, Itoga, Joseph Cabrinha and Grote doing the running.

One of the hardest fought relays will be seen when the two mile relay comes around. Though Palama is favored to finish in the foreground, the Outrigger gang has more than a chance to beat the former. Bill Castanha, George Kahlowai, Edwin Stone, "Scabby" Harrison, Charlie Naiwi or Jonathan Atau will bear the Pals' colors, while Burton, island long distance star, "Waiialua" Low, Greig, Jorgenson, Norman Davis and Medeiros will be the principal figures for Outrigger. The Rainbow school has Scotty McGill, Thomas Maeda, Kawaguchi, Brown, Steere or Tanaka.

Everyone is anticipating a brand new mark for the four mile relay mark when Palama's prize men of war in the persons of Stone, Kahlowai, Vanalles and William Castanha, the island's foremost miler, line up for the run. Outrigger with the fleet Hooper, Low, Jorgenson and Medeiros, can give the Pals the necessary competition to topple the old record.

The medley relay is appearing for the first time in the program. The Beach men are figured to win this event with Hooper, Medeiros, Lindeman and Farden. Palama is using Castanha, Harrison or Kahlowai, Waketake and Tasaka and the University Takeguchi or Dease, McGill, Thompson and Penhallow.

### Other Events

The rest of the dope has it that Fernandez will take the 220 yard low hurdles with Melim a close; either Silva, James or Willie Whittle for the 120 yard high obstacle race; DeMello, wrestling first honors, with Wriston second in the shot put; Lehman of the Army, grabbing the discus honors, with De Mello or Wriston next; Willie Wise, first in the javelin; Jim Cruickshank, second; Milton Carter, winning the laurels, Gannon or Luis, second for high jump; Almert Lemes or Ching first, Ralph Ault third, for the broad jump; Richard Gartley first and Harvey second for the pole vault.
