

# Rainbow Trials At Kam Field For Today

Nine Events on Program,  
Century Should  
Be Close

**T**EAMS entered in the Rainbow Relay carnival Saturday knocked off training after short drills last night and today will start the preliminary skirmish before the championship clash of Saturday.

Trials for the individual competitions of the carnival are scheduled to take place this afternoon at Kamehameha field at 4:30. Included in the events on the program for this afternoon are the 100-yard novice, 120-yard high hurdles, 220-yard low hurdles, high jump, broad jump, pole vault, 16-pound shot put, javelin and discus.

A half dozen interesting contests loom today as the track and field stars of Hawaii prepare to win their respective ways into the finals. The century event, with several interscholastic stars entered, should produce a keen fight for the six places allowed in the finals.
