

TRACK MARKS IN DANGER SATURDAY AT RAINBOW MEET

Only Officials Will Be Allowed On the Field, Chairman Klum Says

Many records will be in danger next Saturday afternoon when the best athletes in Hawaii clash at the Rainbow Relay carnival at Kamehameha field. All of the relay marks will be targets and individual competition will also bring out some fast talent.

Otto Klum, chairman of the committee in charge of arrangements for the meet, announced yesterday that the pole vault will start promptly at 1:30 p. m. and the track events at 2:30 o'clock.

Efforts will be made to run the meet off snappier than in the past and the rules will be that only officials and contestants can be on the field. The officials will be furnished with ribbons and all persons not wearing ribbons will be kept off the field.

Many prep school stars have been entered by various teams, including Castanha of St. Louis who broke the island mile record at the recent interscholastic meet. Castanha will be in the four mile relay and will probably run anchor against B. Hooper, former record holder.
