

Army Heads List With Strong Team Of Stars: Pals Have Large Entry

Six Clubs Enroll Total of 350 Athletes for Coming Meet at Kamehameha Field; Hooper to Run Under Outrigger Colors

THREE HUNDRED AND FIFTY ENTRIES were filed with B. H. Robbins, chairman of the A.A.U. committee on registrations last night when the lists closed for the annual Rainbow Relay Carnival. Army, University of Hawaii, Palama, National Guard, Outrigger Canoe club and the Central "Y" answered the call sent out by Otto Klum, director of athletics at the University, sponsors of the meet, and filed entries last night at the A.A.U. office.

Of the 350 entries filed with the chairman of the registration committee, 89 were by Army, 82 by Palama, 64 by the Varsity, 60 by the Outrigger, 47 by the Guard and 8 by the Central "Y."

Indications presented by the closing of the entry lists for the relay carnival point to a record breaking meet, with the classiest field of entries ever seen in Hawaiian track history.

SCHOLTZ TO RUN

Added to the local talent will be Jackson Scholtz, famed Olympic champion and holder of many world records in the sprints. Scholtz yesterday agreed to run an exhibition race as a special feature of the Rainbow meet. It is likely that he will take part in the 100-yard novice event, by giving the regular entrants a handicap to give the fans a real insight into his ability as a sprinter of the first water. Scholtz is training daily on Alexander field and will be in fairly good shape to compete in the Rainbow and A. A. U. meets.

TRIALS THURSDAY

Otto Klum, who gave the Rainbow Relays their start last year by inaugurating the event in Hawaii, announced last night that the trials for the nine individual events would be held at 4:30 p. m. Thursday at Kamehameha field, the scene of the second annual relay carnival. The championship meet will be held Saturday afternoon.

The feature of the entries is the large list sent in by Captain Lehman, coach and star of the Army team. The soldiers lead the teams in the total number entered and according to rumors from Schofield where the soldiers are going through their daily training, the Army squad will be well in on the division of points on Saturday.

While Army will take to the field the "dark horse" of the 1926 relays, it is figured by close followers of track and field that the fight for first place will center between the Varsity, winner in the first meet, Outrigger and Palama, with the latter having a slight edge over the other leaders.

Reserved seats for the meet have gone on sale and according to the early rush for tickets, the Kamehameha bleachers will be filled to the overflowing Saturday when the second annual Hawaiian relay carnival gets under way. Dawkins-Benny, and Honolulu Sporting Goods are handling the reservations for tickets.
