

# SCHOLTZ DECIDES TO REMAIN IN HONOLULU FOR BIG TRACK MEET

Visiting Cinder Champions Take Brief Workout on  
Alexander Field; Hahn and Hooper to Run  
Three-Quarter Mile Today

JACKSON SCHOLTZ will run in the Rainbow Relay Carnival and the A. A. U. meet here in April, it was decided yesterday after it was learned that transportation back to the mainland could be secured at a date not later than the April 17 championship meet. Whether Lloyd Hahn, Scholtz' running mate during his world jaunt, will remain over for the meets, has not yet been decided by the distance star, but according to present indications he will not remain to show in Honolulu, owing to engagements on the mainland.

Scholtz and Hahn were out on Alexander Field yesterday and went through a half hour of easy training. Starts, jogging and a slow furlong composed the day's drill, the latter coming at the end with the two visitors running even with a field of University of Hawaii and Outrigger sprinters and middle distance runners. Scholtz and Hahn stayed even with the field until the final 50 yards, when they let out and finished in a sprint, which carried them across the line in :26.

Scholtz remained out on the field after training to indulge in a little by-play with the weight men and high jumpers. After tossing the discus around and clearing the bar at a fair height, he jogged into the dressing room and called it a day.

## HAHN WORKS TODAY

This afternoon, the stars will again appear on Alexander Field in their second training session. Hahn is down for a three-quarter mile run with Bert Hooper, Outrigger star and present Island champion, at the mile. The two runners will run the shorter distance at a mile pace and will make no effort to make time.

Besides starts, Scholtz will probably run another furlong or 100

yards with local sprinters who will be training on the field at 5 p. this evening. While only a handful of fans was present yesterday, it is believed that a large turnout will be present tonight when the stars workout, this being the first announcement of their intentions regarding training in this city. They will probably appear at the track at 4:30 today and will go through an intensive half hour of work.

While fans and local track men present yesterday expressed surprise that Scholtz would mix in with anything but his own special events, he explained that he practiced all-around training as a part of his early work in preparing for an event.

"It relieves the monotony of training, and it helps round you into condition," explained Scholtz when asked for his reason for apparently "playing" during practice.

It is expected that Scholtz will enter the 100 and 220-yard events in the A. A. U. meet and will run in a special exhibition at the Rainbow Relay Carnival. The dates of the two meets are April 10, Relay; April 17, A. A. U. championships.
