letes from twelve organizations competed in the various events. This year these relay games should be bigger and better than ever.

120 yard high hurdles.

Medley relay.

Pole vault.

Running high jump.

Running broad jump.

Putting the 16 lb. shot.

Throwing the discus.

Throwing the javelin.

The prizes and awards will be: The Charles Paddock cup to the best novice sprinter of the year. Cups by the University of Hawaii for all relay events. Individual gold medals for members of winning teams. Individual gold, silver and bronze medals for first, second and third places in individual events. A cup for the team winning the meet.

The points will count: Individual events, first, second, third and fourth places count, 5, 3, 2 and 1, respectively. First, second third and fourth places in relay count 10, 6, 4 and 2, respectively.

As this is a sanctioned meet of the Hawaiian A. A. U. it is necessary that all entrants hold an A. A. U. card. Registration blanks may be secured from Mr. Lidga at the Central Y. M. C. A. office.

MONTE CARLO, Feb. 27.—Helen Wills, American tennis champion, will oppose Senorita de Alvarez of Spain tomorrow in the finals of the Connaught cup tournament, with the odds overwhelmingly in her favor.

Experts pointed out today that the Spanish girl had won in the semi-finals from Mlle. Contoslavos of France only with the greatest difficulty, while Miss Wills had defeated the latter twice without the loss of a set.
