WORD has been received here that Bernie Farden was unable to compete in the National A.A.U. track championships due to an injury hs leg suffered in practice. The extent of the injury is not known here, but according to meager reports, the Hawaiian star may be permanently out of the game.

If Farden is so injured as to prevent his entering the track meets next spring, Hawaii will have lost one of her most promising sprinters.

Farden had just arrived. During the local open meets this spring he was a sensation in himself and won the right to make the trip to San Francisco to represent his homeland. His work in practice on the mainland placed him among the favorites in the Junior sprint events.

That this trip may prove to be his last appearance as a track star, seems a cruel trick of fate. He might not have even placed in the championship meet this year—but Farden is composed of the stuff that in a few years would have won him fame and glory as a sprinter of the first water.

Sportsmen in Hawaii are hoping that Farden's injury is not as bad as it is now reported and that next spring when the call for track candidates goes out, the smiling Punahou star will be among those present, doing his stuff in the century and furlong.
