The Deans broke the record last week in order to win from the Outrigger quartet and according to the dope the latter has been given a shake up which will cut off a second from its former running time. Palama has been strengthened by the acquisition of Tasaka, Chun and Cabrinha so that the race today should be a three cornered affair with all three teams standing a chance to win and possibly break the week-old record of 1:32.

The field has its share of scintillators. Dick Gartley, Harold Harvey and Correa will fight it out for the vaulting honors. Gartley holds the island record which is slightly under the 12-foot mark and if conditions are favorable today he will attempt to set up a new mark. Milton Carter will attempt a comeback today against Hartman of the Varsity. Hartman did 5 ft. 11 in. to win last week and Carter cleared 6 feet at the western Olympic try-outs. Ching is favored to win the broad jump but Al Lemes of the O. C. C. team now stands but three inches below the Dean star as a result of a 21 ft. 1 in. leap in the trials. Ching is leading with 21 ft. 4 in. and has hopes of hanging up a new mark. In an extra jump at the trials Thursday he turned in a leap of 21 ft. 9 in.

LEHMAN SHOULD WIN

Lehman is regarded as a sure winner in the discus after having taken that event in the Rainbow Carnival. He has already walked off with the gold medal for the hammer throw. Herman Clarke should keep in step with previous performances and hang up a new mark in the shot. The big Guardsman has been doing this regularly this year. Willie Wise and Jim Cruickshank will have a week-old score to settle today. Last week the latter Dean shattered Wise's javelin mark by a foot. Then in the trials Thursday the former title holder came back and bettered Cruickshank's mark by over a foot. Just what the finals will bring out other than some keen competition remains to be seen.

The officials are urged to make their presence at the track by 1 p. m. today in order that the meet can get under way promptly at 1:30.
