Outriggers and Pals Should Be Stronger Saturday Than in the Rainbows and Deans May Not Walk Off With Honors

The Rainbow Relay meet was a success from every viewpoint and the fact that there were several outstanding individual stars in the university meet, will be an added attraction for the championship affair Saturday.

C. and the Pals will take points away from Otto Klum's klan on the track Saturday. The two club teams have many sure point winners in the track events and while the Deans should come out strong in the field, the latter may not give them enough of a lead to turn the trick.

RELAYS FAVOR DEANS

The fact that there are two relays on the program Saturday will favor the Deans. They won the mile relay without much trouble last week and should repeat again. The half mile relay will be closer and harder fought this Saturday. Palama looks much stronger than it was in the Rainbows. The Pal relay combine will probably consist of Tasaka, Chun, Cabrinha and Lee or Dolim. This quartet will make the winners of the event last Saturday step high and wide to win. The Outrigger half mile team will probably be the same as the one which took second to the Deans last week. But this does not necessarily mean that the beach club is already beaten.
