

Paddock Visit Assured For A. A. U. Annual Track Meet

IT is practically assured that Charles Paddock, world famous sprinter, will come to Honolulu to participate in the coming A. A. U. track meet, according to a report read by Mrs. E. Fullard Leo, secretary, at a meeting of the A. A. U. track and field committee, at a meeting held Thursday evening at the Central Y. M. C. A. A cablegram has been received from Paddock, and after a few minor details have been arranged, in all probability he will come to the islands.

Paddock has agreed to run in the 100 yard, 220 yard and 300 yard dashes if he comes. He will probably go after the Island records in these events.

If Paddock comes, his coming will make this year's A. A. U. track and field meet the biggest ever held in the islands, and in all probability the biggest in years to come.

Three trophies have already been promised. One will be given to the club winning the most points, another to the winner of the half mile relay and the third to the highest individual point winner. The medals of this year are to be of a new design. Medals will be given for the first four places in each event.

Palama took first place last year with Outrigger second. Moft Smith won the individual cup, but the trophy

for the half mile relay was not awarded as both Outrigger and Palama, who took first two places respectively, were disqualified.

Three new teams will enter the meet this year. They are: University of Hawaii, Kamehameha and alumni and Schofield. Instead of a dual contest as it was last year, there will be at least four teams which stand a chance of taking first honors.

The same events, with the exception of the 60 yard dash, which has been dropped, will be held this year. Kamehameha field has been chosen as the place to hold the meet, because of the greater bleacher accommodations. Extra bleachers will be erected as soon as possible, bringing the seating capacity up to 2000 people.

All of the clubs are training now and Palama has already had one meet and is scheduled to meet Kamehameha this afternoon at 3:30 o'clock, at Kamehameha field.
