

# Palamas Sweep A.A.U. Annual Paddock Cuts

## Meet; Two Records Shattered World Record

### In 220 Event

Meinecke Sets New Time In Mile Walk; Pong Establishes New Mark In Discus; John Watt Gathers In Highest Number of Points For Individual.

BERKELEY, March 26—(Associated Press)—Charles Paddock, of the University of Southern California, today ran the 220-yard dash in 20.45 seconds, which is two fifths of a second lower than the world record time for the distance. The time was made in the meet between University of California and University of Southern California.

The world record for the 220-yard dash was set on May 30, 1896, by B. J. Wefers, with a time of 21.15 seconds. The time was equalled by R. C. Craig on May 28, 1910, and by D. F. Lippincott on May 31, 1913. The despatches telling of Paddock's feat do not state whether it will stand as a world's championship time. These times must be approved by the International Amateur Athletic Federation before becoming official world marks.

PALAMA'S track team yesterday took the Outrigger stars down the route for a nobby little cleaning and pressing, the stores of those two teams being 71 and 56 respectively. The 27th Infantry, with a small entry list, took third place away from the Hui Makani with 14 points and the latter club finished fourth with 12. The total army points were 30 by all entries.

These figures are not final, however, for there were more protests issued after and during the day than there are mortgages in a commuting suburb. But at that there is no doubt but that the Virgo-Clark combine was too much for Bill Inman's talent. The Pals placed in every event on the ticket, with the exception of the 120 high hurdles. Outrigger failed to finish a man in the mile walk, mile run, broad jump and five-mile race.

Two records were broken. One in the mile walk and the other in the discus heaving event. Both these feats were accomplished by the Palama entries. It was a most successful day for the gang from Kalihi district.

Other important features of the day were the manner in which Kanahale ran away from Deverill in the 880, and the way in which John Watt dawdled in the low hurdles, allowing Silva to spurt past him at the last jump and come in a winner.

#### Bill Shakes One

Meinecke, of the Palama team, shuffled, shimmied, and squirmed around the track in the mile walk with a lot of room to spare and won the event, beside smashing the record with ease. His time was 8 minutes, 4.25 seconds, as against the record of 8:19.25 set by Downey last year.

In the discus E. K. T. Pong stepped out and tossed the phonograph record a distance of 115 feet 6 1/2 inches, as against the record of 115 feet 1 inch set by R. Ludwig in 1915.

Melling, Outrigger's sprint star, strained a ligament in the trials of the 220-yard dash and could not enter any more events for the day.

Watt's performance in the low hurdles came as a shock to the Outrigger fans. The Cornell star evidently thought he had it all his own way and was loafing along. Suddenly, at the

last hurdle, Silva of Palama took the jump and dashed ahead for a win.

In the relay Tegment, anchor man of the 11th Artillery team, was knocked down by spectators crowding on the track, and was unable to finish.

Watt had it all his own way in the high hurdle event, with no opposition to speak of.

In the 220 the trials eliminated all but three men. There was no fourth place run off.

The half-mile was a splendid race. Deverill was run to a frazzle by Kanahale, who took the pace away from the Outrigger man and came in a winner by about five yards.

Wilson, University of Michigan height man, showed great form and was an easy winner in the pole vault, going six inches higher than his nearest opponent, Sam Hipsa.

#### Cup Winners

If none of the many protests are allowed, Palama will take the Advertiser cup for the club scoring the highest

number of points; Outrigger will get the Relay cup presented by P. H. Notage of the Oahu Sporting Gods company, and John Watt, of Outrigger, will capture the cup offered for the individual scoring the highest number of points, presented by E. O. Hall & Son.

Watt's total is 11 points. Mott-Smith is second with nine, and Meinecke, Wilson, and Sam Hipsa are tied for third place with eight apiece.
