

# FACULTY OF S. C. VARSITY IS BUCKING IDEA OF PADDOCK LEAVING FOR HAWAII ISLES

Charley Paddock, winner of the finals in the 100 meters dash at Antwerp, may not be able to come to Hawaii for the A. A. U. track and field meet on March 26. The faculty of the University of Southern California, at which institution Paddock is a student, is opposing the contemplated trip.

The Hawaiian A. A. U. received a message late yesterday from the University of Southern California to the effect that the faculty did not deem it advisable to permit Paddock to take any extended leave at the present time.

## Still Hoping

This knocked the sunshine from the outlook for the Hawaiian A. A. U. track meet. Saturday night the A. A. U. got a wire from Bob Weaver, president of the A. A. U. of America and a resident of Los Angeles, to the effect that Paddock would come. So after getting the wire yesterday from the faculty, the local A. A. U. wired Weaver again asking him to use his influence to

get Paddock off for the trip. In order to get here for the meet, Paddock must sail from San Francisco next Tuesday.

## Plenty of 'Em

The next three Saturdays will see track meets in Honolulu. The first, Saturday, March 19, will see the Interscholastic meet in which Punahou is regarded as a favorite after the showing made in the Cornell relay games last Saturday.

On the following Saturday will be the big A. A. U. meet and following that will come a meet between the University of Hawaii and the Interscholastic league. And that will about close the track season.
