

HAWAII AFTER MORE TITLE EVENTS

TRACK MEET SCHEDULED IN MARCH

Despite the fact that "the wind she blow like hurricane" all last evening, the board of managers of the Hawaiian A. A. U. held confab in its new headquarters at Room 315, Hawaiian Trust Building and transacted a wealth of business.

It was definitely decided to stage two big outdoor swimming meets this year. The first of these will take place in May and the second in October. The five national championships awarded Hawaii will be staged at these meets.

It was also decided to go after more swimming championship events this year. Some half dozen events, which have been added to the calendar since the annual meet-

ing of the National A. A. U., and the Hawaiian A. A. U. has cast longing eyes upon these numbers. Two of them at least would tickle Hawaii. These two are the 50 yards men's senior outdoor and the 150 yards backstroke. The latter even was put on since McGillivray claims the record at this distance; Warren Ke-aloha having grabbed the records for the 100 yards and 100 meters. The only reason that Warren has not secured the 150 yard record, say the fans, is because he has never gone that distance for a record. If that event comes here, local swimming experts are confident that Ke-aloha will grab another record. The local association will apply for all six events, going on the basis that if it applies for all six it may get three, whereas if it applies for but the two it most wants, it may only get one.

Many Stars

For the May meet swimmers will be brought from the mainland including Margaret Woodbridge from Detroit. For the October meet it is planned to bring swimmers from Australia and Canada as well as from mainland United States. Swimmers from Hilo, Maui and Kauai will be invited to both meets.

It was decided to hold the annual A. A. U. track and field meet in March. For this meet a sprinter or hurdler of Olympic fame will be brought here from California in order to stimulate greater interest in athletics.

The Women's auxiliary was granted sanction for a tank meet to be held in March for women and girls only. D. L. Conkling was appointed a committee of one to look into the possibility of arranging inter-club boxing in Honolulu.
