

# Rangers Take Title in Scrappy Contest: Play Outriggers X1 to a Tie

Blood Was on the Moon at Makiki Field and the Spirit of Charity Seemed to Have Stayed at Home



LOOD was on the moon out at Makiki Field yesterday afternoon when the Rangers and Outriggers played the crucial game of the local soccer series, thereby turning over the league championship to the Rangers who drew with the Surfriders.

The Rangers got their first and only goal in the opening quarter when Simpson scored. From that time on the Outriggers were outclassed, and showed less teamwork than the Rangers who hitched together splendidly.

Outtrigger strove valiantly to equalize during the remainder of the game, but Rangers hung on to their lead and staved off any scoring until the third period, when Elisha Andrews booted one in the net.

The feature of the game was the combination work of the Rangers.

In the other game played, the Pa-

lama Club defeated the Marine eleven 6 to 0. Marines were not able to get together in defensive or offensive work until too late to do any good.

Four games remain on the soccer card for the season here. Next Saturday Rangers play the Marines and Outtrigger meets Palama. On the Saturday following the Marines play the Outriggers and the Palama club tackles the Rangers.
