

HOT FUSS EXPECTED SATURDAY

Rangers and Outriggers Clash in Crucial Soccer Game



ESTERDAY'S football at Makiki field indicates that there will be dirty work at the cross roads when the Rangers and Outriggers meet next

Saturday in the decisive game of the soccer championship series of the island.

Rangers had a tough time defeating Palama two goals to none yesterday afternoon and the Outriggers ran up a score of nine goals to two against the Marines.

Next Saturday the Marines clash with Palama while the Surfers and the Rangers meet in a decisive contest. If Rangers win or draw with Outrigger they take the title of the Honolulu association, while if Outrigger wins that club takes the championship.

The Outriggers yesterday piled up quite a lead on the Gyrenes from Pearl Harbor, but the latter team was fighting all the way. The Marines passing was better than in previous games but they seemed to miss Atwood and Flynn. The men taking the places of these two backs did well but apparently lacked the experience of the two absentees. Marines outside right played a flashy game.

In the second game the Rangers were worried for a time for fear that Palama would equalize the score, and it seemed as though the Pals would manage to do it. Only the final punch was lacking for Palama, for the opportunities were secured by the team several times in the latter half. Simpson scored Rangers first goal and Gillan the second. Palama's goal keeper played a neat game as did Cummins, Comache and Ah Fook, all of whom are newcomers to the round ball game here.
