

Surfers Beat Soldiers By 4-2 Score In Soccer Game

Championship Goes to Outrigger As Result of Yesterday's Play At Schofield Barracks

Playing at Schofield before several thousand spectators the Surfers defeated the Soldiers by four goals to two.

Schofield won the toss, and elected to kick with the wind, exchanges were even for a while, then the soldiers forced the ball down the field. Bailey (who was far from well) missed a kick, and Bonnehyeke rushed the ball past him, and shot into the net at two-yard range, Patey having no chance to save.

The Outriggers then steadied down, and after forcing a couple of corners Walker crossed right in front of the Schofield goal, and the ball was rushed through in the general melee.

After this the ball travelled from end to end of the field, Chillingworth getting in some fine head work, and Parker booting accurately. On the stroke of half-time Bonnehyeke obtained possession and almost got another goal, Mayall rushing across and intercepting. The whistle blew for a "breather" with the score one all, the score fairly reflecting the game.

On the kick off Rosemond ran the ball down the field, tricked McInerny and shot at close quarters, putting the Surfers one up in less than a minute's play. This seemed to dishearten the soldiers, and play slowed down for a time. Ten minutes later Schofield hauled in the penalty area, Ross took the kick, and put the Surfers two up with a high shot in the corner of the net.

Referee Kept Busy

The game became pretty rough and Referee Dease had his hands full. Bailey was getting away long kicks at this stage, and the Outriggers with a comfortable lead, were outplaying Schofield in every department. Fuller, playing his best game of the season was holding the left wing, when Carson passed to Bonnehyeke, who shot straight at Patey from 20 yards out. Patey elected to kick, missed, and the Surfers lead was reduced to a bare goal. This put new pep into the Outrigger team, and they exhibited all-round superiority, but although attacking most of the time, were only able to score once through Jimmy Ho, on a pass from Littlejohn. And the game ended four goals to two in favor of the Outriggers.

The victors displayed fine teamwork in the second half of the game, every man working unselfishly to win.

For Schofield, Bonnehyeke was the star, the halves and backs being erratic at times.
