

Surfers Beat Guardsmen In Soccer Game By 4 - 0 Score

Outrigger Club Is Now At Head of League With Two More Games To Go

Playing for double points on Saturday the Outrigger soccer team beat the National Guard, 4 to 0, in the week-end scrimmage at Makiki field. The game started with the ball continuously in the guards' territory, but stubborn resistance by the citizen soldiers made it a quarter of an hour before Walker shot an oblique one across the goal mouth which Clark handled, but failed to save in time.

Just before the whistle blew for half time, he tricked the backs and screwed the ball into the corner of the net again.

On resuming play the Guard forced the ball into Outrigger territory and secured a couple of corners which came to naught. Then the ball was transferred in a clever bit of play to the Surfers' left wing and Walker passed to Littlejohn who trapped and scored close in.

The Surfers besieged the Guard goal after this, but Clark defended in great style. Finally Rosemond dribbled through and scored the last goal of the match.

As it had been agreed to play for double points, the Surfers are now at the head of the league, with 12 points out of 12 possible. They have still to play one against the Rangers and once against the crack Schofield team.
