

Hawaii U and Canoemen Are Victorious In Doubleheader

University Defeats Palama and Outriggers Down Chinese in Opening Basketball Games

The Honolulu basketball season opened Saturday night at the National Guard Armory with a snappy doubleheader, in which the University of Hawaii defeated Palama Settlement, 44 to 20, while the Outrigger Cange club put it over the All-Around Chinese by 43 to 21. Both contests were fast and clean, although in each case it was not difficult to see from the beginning which was the better team. The first game, between the Varsity and Palama showed more team work than the second contest, but both were fine exhibitions, and especially so for the first games of the season. If last night was a forecast of what is to come later Honolulu will see some real basketball before the present schedule is played out.

William Chung, diminutive Varsity forward, drew first blood of the season when he tossed a neat running shot from the foul line shortly after the opening of the Varsity-Palama game. Goecas immediately retaliated for Palama and for several moments it was a close heat. After the first two baskets, however, Coach Klum's varsity never lost the lead, and gradually pulled ahead until at the end of the first quarter the score stood 13 to 5 in its favor. At the end of the next period the Varsity had doubled its count, while the Pals had secured but one additional basket.

During the last half the Varsity defense weakened somewhat and Palama was able to run up a fair score before the collegians pulled themselves together. The final score was 44 to 20.

William and Walter Chung, Farden, Matsuguma and Sam Fuller were the Varsity stars, while Goecas and Sam Hipa did the best work for the losers.

The Second Game

The second game, between the Outriggers and the All-Around Chinese, was also hard fought, but lacked the team work displayed in the first contest. The final count was, Outriggers 43, A. C. A. 21. The final results for each game being very nearly the same. "Skeet" Swan played a feeding game and did little shooting on his own account. Huffman and Nottage were the other Outrigger stars, and Ah Fo Pung was the best performer for the A. C. A.
