

Givens Urges Grammar Schools To Compete For Leo Cup On Sept. 26

Army Swimmers Will Compete in the Open Events But Team Not Prepared to Try for Relay Swim This Time

EMPTY blanks for the Women's Auxiliary Swimming meet have been sent to the different affiliated clubs of the A. A. U. as well as the schools and departments of the Service. Mr. Givens, superintendent of education, has accepted the conditions of the Leo Cup and is urging the grammar grades of the public schools to hold trials and enter the best 50-yarder in each school. As there are also three medals for this event, the winner will get a medal while her school gets the cup.

The Hui Nalu relay team will be out to hold the women's relay trophy won last year against Outrigger, Hui Makani, Y. M. C. A. and Nuuanu Y. The latter will have a good opportunity to show donor Westerveldt what his tank enables them to do. While these are the only active swimming clubs, there is nothing to prevent any of the other affiliated clubs entering teams.

The Navy has been active in aquatics lately and their meet this week should serve as trials to enter their best in the open events for men and line up a four-men relay team to meet teams from other branches of the Service. Colonel Landers has decided not to try for the Davies Army Sector Cup at this time. The army swimmers who went to the mainland trials have only just returned, and while not lined up for a relay should offer good competition in the open events.
