Crescent City Athletes Her Island Diamond Series; Capped By Recent Illness Junior Crew

Clem Akina, Hilo rowing men from the Big Island invaded Honolulu the rowing races in the harbor Saturday.

The Hiloites are out to regain the races at Hilo last Fourth of July, grabbed in those races. Their large numbers indicates Hilo's determination in the regatta this year.

According to reports from Hilo the selection of crews to represent the Big Island in the regatta came after a series of heartbreaking mishaps which have followed the oarsmen the past several weeks. The final selection of crews was made Wednesday morning.

Less than two weeks ago one of the members of the senior crew was seriously ill and several others were suffering from attacks of influenza. For a time it looked as though substitutes would have to be placed in the senior boat and as it is at least one of the men will be a long ways from being in first class shape when he pulls in the senior race Saturday.

Despite these handicaps Clem Akina has kept the spirits of his men up and the senior bunch from Hilo is expected to show much better than they did in the July 4 races.

Hopes In Junior Crew

Hilo's hopes in the regatta are mostly in the junior crew. Reports from Hilo are that Akina has a "wonder crew" to place in the junior race and the Hiloites have much confidence in them. Akina believes his junior crew has the best chance to win of the four crews making the trip.
