

Committee of Engineers To Draft Plans For Big Expansion In the Future

Board of Directors Decide To Go Ahead With Fill and To Bring Men's Membership Roster Up To 1000; More Women Guests To Be Sought; To Cooperate In Fleet Entertainment

The first definite steps toward making the Outrigger Canoe Club a real big institution, one in keeping with the growing community, were taken last night at the meeting of the board of directors when it was decided to appoint a committee of engineers and architects from among the members to make plans for a big expansion in the future, including a gymnasium, a natatorium and other things along this line.

This committee will get together shortly and decide upon just what the exact nature of the expansion will be, draw up plans and write out suggestions and lay the whole matter before the annual meeting of the members this summer. The expansion plans will cover the next five years and will be thoroughly comprehensive as to the future life of the club. Dr. Paul Withington and Henry Asch will represent the board of directors on this special committee.

Membership

The board decided last night to start a campaign to bring the membership of men in the club up to

1000 and to add about 200 women guests. The board also decided to continue with the fill in of the lagoon and to drag more sand in.

George Armitage was appointed to take the place of Percy Deverill, who has resigned from the board as a director due to pressure of business duties.

A committee consisting of George ("Dad") Center and George Armitage was appointed to cooperate with the community committee on the entertainment of the fleet. The committee will arrange a system of handling the club canoes and put the fleet of craft in the charge of one man who will be responsible for the steersman to the club.
