

# HOOPER PLANS TO GO ANYWAY FOR MARATHON

Some of University R. O. T.  
C. Men May Get In As  
Well, Even If Plans Fail

Victor Ligda, secretary of the Hawaiian A. A. U.; announced today that there is a movement on foot to send an island track and field team to the junior and senior national A. A. U. championships in San Francisco around the Fourth of July.

Burton Hooper of the Outrigger Canoe club, who won the mile event and set a new island record at the recent Hawaiian A. A. U. meet, has planned to go to the coast anyway whether the local body decides to send a team or not. Of course he would like to go with the team if a team goes. He plans to enter the six-mile race in the A. A. U. senior meet and the mile in the junior meet. Ligda is training him now for those events.

The best track and field men of the University of Hawaii, Teddy Hair, W. Montcastle, Duke Thompson, Eddie Fernandez, Johnny Morse, B. Cruickshank, J. Cruickshank and Willie Wise, will attend the R. O. T. C. camp at American Lake, Washington. This camp concludes late in June and they probably will be back in San Francisco to compete in the junior meet and also the senior meet.

## Others

Bernard Farden who made :09 4-5 in the century, Milton Carter, who set an island mark of 6 feet 1 3-4 inches in the high jump and Dick Gartley the pole vaulter, are three men suggested for the Hawaiian team besides Hooper. All except Gartley are eligible for the junior meet. But Gartley is good enough for the senior pole vault.

All these men together with the University of Hawaii men are members of the Outrigger Canoe club and as the A. A. U. meet is a club affair they would give the surf organization a good chance to win the meet.
