## PAVILION TO BE MOVED UP NEAR KALAKAUA AVE.

### Lockers To Be Built Under Pavilion; Plenty of Room For Recreational Courts

Improvements and renovations are expected to be under way at the Outrigger Canoe Club in the near future for the board of directors of the club last night adopted the plot plan submitted by Hart Wood, one of the members of the club's architects' committee, as a working basis for the project. The plan submitted by Wood had also been gone over by the other members of the committee, Ralph Fishbourne and Guy N. Rothwell, the latter one of the original members of the club.

The plan contemplates the transfer of the pavilion to the newly-filled land, the new location of the pavilion to be some 30 feet or so from Kalakaua Ave. The front yard will be beautified by a driveway, trees, flowers and greensward, and the structure itself will be renovated so that it will be attractive to the eye.

#### Basket Lockers

The pavilion under this plan will be elevated and the space below with wings added will be used for dressing rooms set on a concrete floor. The basket locker system will enable the club to put in 1000 lockers for women on the Moana side and 1000 lockers on the town side for the men. The details of the women's side of the pavilion dressing rooms will be worked out by the women's committee. Under the plot plan it is proposed to raise the roof of the pavilion, permitting the upper part to be converted into a recreational hall and gymnasium which will be large enough to hold a basketball court. This phase of the scheme is for the future.

The women will have access to the beach by a path down the Moana side of the club grounds and the men by a path down the townside of the grounds. In the space between the paths, the pavilion and the beach will be room for recreation courts, volleyball and possibly tennis.

The plot plan does not disturb the hau trees and lanais as they stand at present and it is probable that the commissary will continue in the present location.

#### Cooperating

The club officials are cooperating with the officials of the new hotel company which is to build on the Seaside hotel location. The hotel officials said some time ago that if the club moved its pavilion back so as to give the hotel an unobstructed view of Diamond Head, the hotel would pay for the cost of moving.

Provision for canoe shelters probably will be made by the erection of low sheds not far from the water line, but that detail has not been fully worked out.

The present plan of club improvements calls for an expenditure running close to \$25,000. The directors feel it may not be necessary to spend that amount and their disposition is to be as economical as possible.

President Joseph R. Farrington of the club was authorized to appoint a special committee to investigate what arrangements can be made to finance the project and on the special committee will be Henry Asch, Alexander Hume Ford and several others.
