

Aquatic Meet Arrangements Are Complete

Complete arrangements for the annual A. A. U. swimming meet to be held at the Punahou tank on the evenings of October 29, 30 and 31, have been announced by Victor Ligda, secretary of the Hawaiian chapter of the A. A. U. This meet is particularly noteworthy because of the fact that two noted Pacific coast aquatic stars are going to compete against local talent. Both Lester Smith and Elenore Garrati have agreed to come here for the meet, and they represent the best swimmers on the coast. Lester Smith is rated as one of the big drawing cards at meets on the mainland, while Miss Garrati holds several women's records.

This meet is open to all registered amateurs in good standing who have filed entrance sheets on or before Saturday October 24 at 1 p. m. Trials will be held at the Punahou tank on the first two nights of the meet, with the finals the closing night. No person who has not competed in the trials will be allowed to start in the final races. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to those placing, and a cup is to go to the winner of the meet. An entry fee of twenty-five cents will be charged for every event entered and must accompany the entry form. The fees will be returned if the contestant competes in the events for which he signed up.

Four water polo teams will give exhibition games, one on the first night, another on the second, and the victors of each of these games will play on the closing night. No points towards winning the meet are to be given for the water polo games. It is probable that Palama, Hui Makani, Hui Nalu, and Outrigger will enter teams for this sport.

An entertainment committee is to be formed to greet the mainland swimmers when they arrive, and make arrangements for their entertainment during their stay in Honolulu. A luncheon at the Ad club and an afternoon at the Outrigger Canoe club have already been decided upon, and other plans will be made in the near future.
