Directors Decide to Call Meeting Of All Members To Vote On Proposed Plan

Directors Favor Giving Women Representation on Committees; Marks Another Step In Development Program; 200 New Lockers Will Arrive Soon To Complete Equipment of New Bathhouse

Directors of the Outrigger Canoe club at their monthly meeting last night voted to call a meeting of the full membership for Saturday, Feb. 6, at 3 p. m., for the purpose of considering amendments to their constitution under which women will be admitted to membership in the club.

Under the present constitution men only may participate in the government of the club, although the club maintains a department for women at the present time in which they have the privileges of bathing facilities and the grounds as "guests" without any control in the affairs of the organization.

The proposed amendment to the constitution was originally intended to pave the way for a merger of the Outrigger club and the Women's Auxiliary which, according to formal notices sent to its members, plans to change its name and build a new club house on a strip of land adjacent to the ewa side of the Moana hotel property.

The Outrigger Canoe club, in planning to admit women to membership, expects to give them representation on its governing committees and to give them control of the management of the new women's bathhouse.

Additional bathing facilities provided by their new building are expected to open the way for increasing the women's membership of the club by two or three times its present number.

Marks Second Step

The proposed amendment to the constitution marks the second step in the program of the development of the club under which the rearrangement of building and beautification of the grounds will have been completed sometime this year.

Plans for the planting of attractive shrubbery and trees in front of the club are in the hands of Mrs. Paul Withington, who has arranged to have the Outrigger circle give its assistance in this work. The planning is expected to start within the next few weeks after a diagram showing how the new entrances and the parking space has been completed.

200 New Lockers

It was reported to the meeting last night that 200 additional lockers ordered for the men's bathhouse were expected to arrive sometime within the next two months.

The new lockers are expected to complete the equipment of the new men's bathhouse which is designed to accommodate 1000 members.

Following the special meeting of the club, called for the first Saturday in February, the club expects to make plans to enlarge its membership.

Mona Williams and William Maket, regulars of the 1925 squad, will flank Schady and complete the "Y's" best offensive combination. Williams and Maket have developed splendidly, showing a marked improvement over last
