

# Total Amount Received Yesterday Was \$434 as Fans Rallied to Cause

David Conkling and Bob Macconel Active in Campaign for Funds to Send Hawaiian Champion to St. Augustine

YESTERDAY morning we asked if Honolulu was going to send Mariechen Wehselau to Florida.

All day yesterday the fans were answering our question with dollars, fives and tens. It was a big day for the Florida drive, and when the window closed in THE ADVERTISER office at 5 o'clock, the total had been swelled from \$276, collected on the first day of the drive, by \$434 in cold cash. As a result there now rests in the treasury \$710, and although there is still a matter of nearly \$500 to be raised, we feel confident that by the end of the campaign today, Miss Wehselau's trip to Florida will be assured and that the Black and Gold of Hawaii nei will be among the colors flying at the national meet in St. Augustine.

## CONKLING WORKS HARD

David L. Conkling, manager of the 1924 Hawaiian Olympic team, and a strong booster of swimming in the islands, was out early yesterday morning. "Poupou," first formed a "Mariechen Wehselau" club, with the membership at \$5 per head. Then he went to seek 100 live charter members, and returned with 50 active—and their subscriptions. Incidentally, during his ramblings about town in search of members to his own little club, Conkling ran across a number of smaller contributions which he turned into the general fund.

In all, Conkling collected \$301 all by himself yesterday, and when he left the office last night after making his report, he promised us another \$300 to be delivered at noon today. So, when you meet the energetic Mr. Conkling this morning, be prepared to join Hawaii's youngest and most beneficial club.

## MACCONEL ENTHUSIASTIC
