Kirschbaum Says Miss

Chance

BILL KIRSCHBAUM, Honolulu swimmer, and a member of the last Olympic team, says that he believes Mariechen Wehselau stands a good chance of beating Ethel Lackie, the one woman she has to beat at St. Augustine, "if Squeaky only keeps her head."

Bill saw Miss Lackie win from Mariechen in Paris, and declares that the local girl used very poor judgment, and that Miss Lackie on the other hand swam a heady race, spurted at just the right time and outsmarted Miss Wehselau.

"Mariechen may have learned her lesson.
