

Admit Women As Members of the Outrigger Club

Amendments To Constitution Accepted By Members Without Protest

Members of the Outrigger Canoe Club at a special meeting Saturday afternoon on the club grounds accepted without a dissenting vote amendments to the constitution admitting women to active membership.

While the revised constitution allows women to become members on the same basis as men with full voting privileges by paying the same dues, it also makes provision for associate memberships under which the "women guests" may continue in the organization with the dues they now pay.

The "women guests" of the Outrigger Canoe Club will automatically become associate members without paying any additional dues.

Officers of the club explained that the amendments to the constitution paved the way for full participation by women on the same basis as men in the government of the club.

Plans are now under way for the creation of several women's committees to govern those activities in which the women are especially interested.

Regular Session

The regular meeting of the board of directors of the club will be held Wednesday night to take up various new improvements now that the question of women's membership has been settled.

Joseph R. Farrington, president, presided at the meeting Saturday afternoon while the amendments to the constitution were presented by Warren Dease, a member of the board of directors and past president, who acted as secretary of the meeting.

A financial report was submitted by Henry Asch, member of the board of directors. The necessity for a canvass of those members who have not already contributed to the building fund were pointed out by Asch.
