Miss Mariechen Webselau, Hawaiian champion, who left Honolulu for Florida last month is ready, according to brief reports, for the gun that will send her into action against her rivals for the aquatic crown. Whether she will swim in the 50-yard event, or whether she will enter the pentathlon tonight, has not been learned here, but it is believed that she will elect the sprint event in which she ranks with the best in the country, and will

leave the all-around compet to other swimmers. Should the Hawaiian champion enter the Hawaiian champion enter pentathlon she would stand an excellent chance of winning, but it is expected that she will confine her activities to sprint

confine her activities to sprint swimming and will forego the opportunity of competing in the other offering.
