

Leading Women Athletes Ready For the Opening Of Title Swimming Meet

Race Between Wehselau and Garatti In 50-Yard Event
Expected To Be Thriller; Adelaide Lambert Favored
To Win Pentathlon From Lily Bowmer May and Others

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla., Feb. 9.—Two score of the world's leading women swimmers made their final preparations today for the opening tonight of the five-day aquatic meet for the women's national indoor swimming and diving championships.

Eleven title competitions will be held, with seven titleholders present. The only absentee titleholder is Helen Wainwright.

The program tonight provides for the pentathlon and the 50-yard free style swim. Adelaide Lambert is favored to win the pentathlon from Lily Bowmer May of Santa Monica, Calif., Dorothy Colter of Detroit, Doris O'Mara of New York and Ruth Elberfield of Chattanooga, who also will contest.

A great race is expected in the 50-yard free style, with Eleanor Garatti of San Rafael, Calif., defending her title against Mariechen Wehselau of Honolulu. Miss Wehselau defeated Miss Garatti in a race in Honolulu last summer, and a close contest is expected tonight. Ethel Lackie of New York also will enter the 50-yard event tonight. Others expected to enter are Virginia Losee of Detroit, Loretta Cannon of Baltimore and May Lambert.
