

# MORE SWIM MARKS ARE SHATTERED

## Miss Norelius, Geraghty Establish New Aquatic Records

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla., Feb. 12.—Martha Norelius of the Women's Swimming Association, New York, retained her title as the 500 yard free style champion tonight in defeating Ethel McGary of the same club by a fraction of a second in the Women's National A. A. U. championships here. Her time was 6:49 3-5 sec.

Agnes Geraghty set a new world's record by more than six seconds to retain her title as the 100 yard breaststroke champion. Ethel Lackie established a new American record of :44 3-5 to win the 75 yard handicap from scratch. The old mark of :45 was held by Gertrude Ederle.

Agnes Geraghty broke the record for the 100 yard breast stroke when she was twice clocked 2 seconds under the former record. In the second heat and last heat Geraghty's time was 1:19 2-5.

In the trial heat it was 1:22 and her old record was 1:25.

Sybil Bauer broke her own world's record set in 1925 at Brighton Beach when she swam the 200 yard back stroke in 2:47 4-5. Her old time was 2:51 4-5.
