

MANY TEAMS ARE ENTERED IN THE RELAY CARNIVAL

Scholz Will Run As Added Attraction At Rainbow Relay Carnival

According to all present indications the Rainbow Relays, scheduled for Kamehameha field April 10 at 1:30 p. m., will be one of the highlights of the track season this year.

At present many more have signed up than last year when the first annual Rainbow Relays were held, and it is expected that there will be the biggest turnout ever. Very keen competition is expected. The best officials in Honolulu will be obtained for the meet. The events themselves will be run off in excellent style. Every effort will be made to keep the field clear of all persons except the officials and the participants. The spectators will be given a chance to view all pit and field events clearly.

Jackson Scholz, holder of the Olympic record in the furlong, will give an exhibition.

The University of Hawaii team, according to David Penhallow, manager, is in fair form, but not as good as last year.

The army this year is putting in a concentrated team instead of several sector teams, as it did last year.

The Palama and Outrigger teams are exceptionally strong this year and are expected to show up well in the meet.

The Rainbow Relays were originated last year by Coach Otto Klum and sponsored by the university. The Deans won the meet by a total of 87 points, with Outrigger second with 55 points and Palama third with 47 points. Several records were broken and the meet as a whole was a decided success.
