

ARRANGE CARD FOR SWIM EVENT AT PUNAHOU TANK

Tentative Program of Open Events Agreed Upon By Swimming Coaches

The tentative program for the Japan-Hawaii swimming meet was drawn up yesterday noon at a meeting of swimming coaches and club representatives held at the Central Y. M. C. A.

The big meet will be staged in Waterhouse Memorial tank, Punahou, the nights of June "3 and 1" under the auspices of the Outrigger Canoe club, The Star-Bulletin and the Nippu Jiji. A team composed of the six leading swimmers in Japan is being brought here from Japan for the meet and will arrive on June 12.

The committee in charge of the meet also decided yesterday to make offers to sports leaders on Maui and Hawaii to have the Japanese team appear in meets on those islands. If arrangements can be made meets for the visitors will be held on both of those islands.

The tentative program for the two nights of the big meet at Punahou includes 23 events. Several slight changes will probably be made in the program before it is definitely accepted.

All of the open events for men have been figured in meters at the request of the Japanese swimmers, who prefer to swim the same distances they will have to swim at the next Olympics.

The events agreed upon at yesterday's meeting are:

Men's events—100 meters free style, 200 meters free style, 400 meters free style, 22 meters back stroke, 400 meters breast stroke, 800 meters relay, springboard diving, plain and fancy high diving, water polo, and 300 meters medley, including the 100 meters breast stroke, 100 meters back stroke and 100 meters free style.

Women's events—100 meters free-style, 400 meters free style, 300 meters medley (same distance as men's and 100 meters breast stroke junior.

Service events—100 yards free style, 100 yards breast stroke and 50 yards novice.

Boys' events—100 yards free style for boys under 15 years, 50 yards free style for boys under 13 years, 300 meters medley junior (same events as men's).

Girls' events—50 yards free style for girls under 15 years.

Events for local Japanese swimmers—100 yards free style open and 50 yards free style novice.
