

ADD NEW EVENT TO PROGRAM FOR SWIMMING MEET

Japanese Swimmers Re- quest That 100 Meters Backstroke Be Added

One new event, the 100 meters backstroke for men, has been added to the program for the Japan-Hawaii swimming meet to be held in Punahou tank Friday and Saturday nights, June 18-19, according to announcement made yesterday by "Dad" Center, chairman of the meet committee.

By adding the extra event to the program and switching some of those already on the program, the committee has arranged so that the visiting Japanese swimmers will perform in their best events each night.

An exceptionally large entry list has been received for the big meet, all of the leading local swimmers being entered in their favorite events. At yesterday's meeting the committee was informed that tickets are going strong and that indications are that there will be a capacity crowd in attendance each night. Each night the meet begins at 7:30 p. m.

The Japanese swimmers held another workout yesterday and showed that they are in the best of shape. They will enter the meet big favorites in the open events, although Sam Kahanamoku, Warren Kealoha, Benton Wood, Johnny Woodd and other local stars are expected to force them to the limit.

Yawl Mollilou Is Forced Out Of Yacht Race

Local Wireless Operators Unable To Make Contact With Yachts

SAN PEDRO, July 15.—The Mollilou, in command of Skipper Hesselberger, returned here late yesterday and is definitely out of the trans-Pacific yacht race to Honolulu. The Mollilou was forced to turn back after reaching a point 50 miles off Catalina island because of the illness of a member of the crew, John McNamara, who was rushed to a hospital at Avalon. He is said to be suffering from appendicitis.

Late radio reports relayed here stated that the Invader was leading the race with the Poinsettia trailing and the Mariner third. They are all Class A boats.

Efforts on the part of local wireless operators to get in touch with the yachts in the Los Angeles-Hawaii race have failed so far, but the operators will renew their efforts tonight.

The naval radio operators as well as local amateurs are "listening in" to try and pick up messages from the boats. Two of the yachts are said to be equipped with sending apparatus of 500 miles radius.

The navy has instructed the operators here to try to get in touch with the yachts tonight and it is expected that they will make contact. Ray Rietow of the Amateur Radio club is handling the wireless communications and any amateurs who "pick up" messages to or from the yachts are requested to get in touch with Rietow.

The Invader, according to dispatches from the mainland, is still leading in the race and local yachtsmen expect Lee's boat to arrive here first. It has been predicted that the first yacht will arrive June 23.
