

NAMES OF STARS ON ENTRY LIST FOR SWIM MEET

**Trials Will Be Held In Puna-
hou Tank At 7:30 P. M.
On Thursday**

Everything is in readiness for the coming swimming meet between the Japanese team and the locals, according to the reports of the officials in charge.

This struggle between the visitors and the island cohorts brings leading swimmers of both countries in what is probably the biggest event of this kind ever staged locally. The latest entry to be announced is Henry Luning, back stroke swimmer who was a member of the American team in the Olympic meet.

Three nights have been devoted to the meet in order to take care of the many entrants and numerous events to be staged. Thursday the trial heats will be held, starting at 7:30, while on Friday and Saturday the nights scheduled for the main events, starting at the same hour.

There is a possibility that arrangements will be made for the team to come here for a series of games early next year before the Coast League teams start their spring practice.

Valencia has informed Beaven that if the team visits Hawaii it will be under the management of Ivan Howard, manager of the Oakland team in the Pacific coast league.
