He won the 400 meters event to establish a Hawaiian record, and although the time was slow, he was hardly pressed after the first 100 meters. Pang, veteran of Hui Nalu, was second, and Bill Bergin was third.

Hui Nalu opposed Outrigger in the water polo game, the closing event of the meet, and although outclassed from the outset, never quit. The game was hard fought and interesting and was won by the O. C. C. at 5-1. Joe Guerrero sneaked in the only goal for the losers with a well-timed shot, while Hart Wood, Clarence Crabbe and Makinney did the counting for Outrigger.
