FOLLOWING is the official program of the National outdoor championship swimming events under the auspices of the Sesqui Centennial Exposition Association, sanctioned by the Middle Atlantic Association of the A. A. U.:

- One-mile free style.
- 440-yard free style.
- 220-yard Back stroke.
- 100-meter free style.
- 880-yard relay (four men each to swim 220 yards).
- 880-yard free style.
- 440-yard breast stroke.
- 300-meters medley.
- Fancy diving (10-foot spring-board).

Plain and fancy highdiving (from 15 and 30 foot platforms).
