

Gala Occasion Planned By Committee; To Take Place At Harbor Piers

Special Charleston Contests to Be Feature of Brilliant Evening; Proceeds Will Be Used to Further Interests of Swimming in Islands; Waialua Subscribes to Philadelphia Fund

THE "SWIMMERS' BALL," to provide funds for the present trip of Hawaiian swimmers to Philadelphia, and to raise a part of the money necessary to finance the proposed invasion of Japan by a Hawaiian team late this summer, will be held at Piers 8-9-10, on the evening of July 24, it was decided yesterday at a meeting of the special committee appointed to handle the trip of the Hawaiian team to Philadelphia. The same committee will be in charge of arrangements for the trip to Japan, which is slated to start about August 25.

Sponsoring the dance on the waterfront are The Advertiser, Star-Bulletin and Nippon Jiji, three leading dailies of this city, and the Outrigger Canoe club and the Hawaiian A.A.U., the latter through its president William T. Rawlins. It was through these same institutions that the trip to Philadelphia of "Dad" Center, Warren Kealoha and Johnny Woodd was made possible.

The purpose of the dance and entertainment which will be held at the new piers, overlooking Honolulu's harbor, is to provide funds with which to complete the financing of the Philadelphia trip and to provide sufficient money with which to start the Hawaiian team on its way to Japan.

CHARLESTON CONTESTS

Two orchestras will be engaged to furnish music during the evening, and a program of special stunts and entertainment features will be offered to the public. Included on the program will be Charleston championships, the details of which will be announced at a later date. Dawkins-Benny has offered a trophy for the Charleston champion.

The special committee appointed last week was enlarged at yesterday's meeting in order to take care of arrangements for the dance and for the Japan tour. Cecil Benny was appointed treasurer of the committee and S. Furukawa was made an active member. Co-operating with the committee is F. E. Crumley, who will serve as a committee chairman in connection with the entertainment.

Joseph R. Farrington, president of the Outrigger Club, chairman of the executive committee made the following appointments for the July 24 celebration: Arrangements and concessions, F. E. Crumley; finances and tickets, Cecil Benny; stunts, music and special features, Ezra Crane; decorations, John Steel and Joseph Farrington.

SALE TO OPEN SOON

Tickets will be donated by the Nippon Jiji and will go on sale some time this week. They will be handled by all swimming clubs, the three newspapers sponsoring the event, Dawkins-Benny company, Honolulu Sporting Goods, Police department and Fire department. Posters announcing the event, printed by The Advertiser, will be displayed Thursday.

The special drive for funds with which to finance the trip of the Hawaiian team to Philadelphia has netted nearly enough to care for Center and his swimmers while at the national championships. Louis B. Woodd, father of Johnny Woodd, reported from Waialua yesterday with \$150, subscribed by the citizens of that town to the general swimming fund. This, together with money subscribed by local citizens, will be wired to Center this afternoon in order that he will have sufficient funds to carry him through the trip.

A complete list of the Waialua subscribers and those who assisted in Honolulu will be carried in the sports pages of The Advertiser at an early date. E. Souza, F. Souza and H. A. Rudin are the men responsible for the Waialua collection.

MORE MONEY NEEDED

Several hundred dollars are yet needed, to be sent to Center this afternoon. The necessary amount will be raised quietly this morning and will be dispatched this afternoon in order that the famous swimming coach will receive it on arrival in San Francisco with his charges tomorrow.

ALL OUT FOR THE BALL!

The main interest, however, until the national championships beginning July 28 will be the July 24 celebration on the waterfront. Swimming fans and followers in the city will be asked to co-operate with the committee in charge and it is expected that a large amount will be
