

NEW MARK FOR RELAY HUNG BY SWIMMERS

Kahanamoku, Crabbe Bros.,
Woodd and Pang All Make
Points In Osaka Meet

Japan Wins Tournament, 13
To 8; Course Slowed Down
By Heavy Wind In P. M.

OSAKA, Japan, Sept. 11.
—The H a w a i i swimming
team today set a new
world's record for the 400-
meters relay race in today's
aquatic meet here between
Hawaiian and Japanese
swimmers.

The Japanese* swimmers
won the session, with 13
points to Hawaii's 8. A heavy
early afternoon wind slowed down
the course, and possibly pre-
vented the breaking of other rec-
ords. The temperature of the wa-
ter was 22 degrees centigrade (71.6
degrees Fahrenheit).

Except for the relay race, Japa-
nese swimmers took all the first
places. The summaries:

100 meters free style swim—Kat-
suo Takeishi, Japan, first; Johnny
Woodd, Hawaii, second; Sam Ka-
hanamoku, Hawaii, third. Win-
ner's time, 1 minute 8 seconds flat.

400 meters free style swim—No-
buo Arai, Japan, first; Clarence
Crabbe, Hawaii, second; Katayama,
Japan, third. Winner's time, 6
minutes 16 2-5 seconds.

200 meters breast stroke—Yoshi-
yuki Tsuruta, Japan, first; Hyakuo
Isono, Japan, second; Tsunenobu
Ishida, Japan, third; Ah Kong
Pang, Hawaii, fourth. Winner's
time, 2 minutes 57 1-5 seconds.

400 meters relay race—Won by
Hawaii, time 4 minutes 12 2-5 sec-
onds (new world's record). Ha-
waiian team—Sam Kahanamoku,
Eddie Crabbe, Clarence Crabbe,
Johnny Woodd. Japanese team—
Nobuo Arai, Glyo Saito, Hiroshi
Yoneyama, Katsuo Takeishi.
