

OUTRIGGER TO ERECT ANOTHER CANOE SHELTER

Bids On Work At Waikiki To Be Opened On Next Tuesday

Plans and specifications for alterations to the buildings at the Outrigger Canoe club, Waikiki, have been completed by Dickey & Wood, architects, and bids will be opened next Tuesday, it was announced today.

The changes include the construction of a spacious new canoe shed and alterations to an existing building which when remodeled will be used as the commissary and for the executive offices.

The work will be paid for by the Territorial Hotel Co, in exchange for land now controlled by the club, which will be turned over to the use of the new Royal Hawaiian hotel.

The long, brown building which now stands behind the hau arbor, at an angle, will be swung around toward the beach, moved to the west and rehabilitated to contain the commissary and offices. The present canoe shed and lanai will be torn down and a new structure erected to the east of it, somewhat back from the water's edge.

The cost of the improvements is estimated at approximately \$4000.
