

Lily Bowmer Stars In Two Events At Punahou; Post Shatters Record

Free Style Service Event for 220 Yards Goes by Boards; Los Angeles Visitors Enjoy Sport; Arthur Bent Makes Address; Races Are Hard Fought

THE Marines landed first Saturday night, when S. L. Post broke the harbor record in the 220 service free style during the Uluniu meet in the Punahou tank. Several seconds were shaved off the former record, 2:49, by Olsen, when Post swam it in 2:34 4-5. This is the second mark shattered by Post, as he also won the 100-yard novice swim on Friday night.

Before a gallery thronged with both Honolulu and Los Angeles swimming enthusiasts, the swimmers in the second and final night of the Uluniu meet did a great deal to strengthen the friendship between the two communities. Arthur S. Bent of the Los Angeles chamber of Commerce complimented the contestants for their fine showing of sportsmanship and said he was glad to see Lily Bowmer May, who won five first places, bring back the Los Angeles cup.

CUP TO DOT WATERS

Janice Lovett did not win the Swanzy cup, in spite of Saturday's story, as she was not entered for it. Whether she would have won it or not, is impossible to determine. The fact remains that Dorothy Waters won it and won it well with 19 points.

Leilehua Judd placed second with 15 points and Caroline Shepherd took third with 11 points. The Swanzy cup is offered to the swimmer winning the highest number of points in five events.

The first event on the program, 50 yards for boys under 12, was won by diminutive Louis Woodd in 35 seconds. Okita placed second and Watura made a good third. The little fellows wore the only appropriate costume for swimming, miniature trunks that allowed plenty of movement, and the audience cheered them repeatedly.

CENTURY TO LILY MAY

Lily May Bowmer, or rather Lily Bowmer May, take your choice, had as difficulty in winning an easy first in the 100 yards freestyle for women. Her time was 1.4 3-5. Cecily Cunha placed second and Leilehua Judd third.

The 100 yards for boys under 15 was won by Tom Linn in 1.6 1-5. S. Yoshikawa took second and J. Rakuya made a good third.

The 440 yards freestyle for men was one of the most grueling swims of the meet. H. Sharp took first place after a gallant effort in the time of 5.52 4-5. T. Ellis made his second place well and Asano swam third.

Caroline Shepherd won the plunge for women, she covered 68 feet and 5 inches. Cecily Cunha took second with 57 feet and 8 inches. Dorothy Waters won third with a float of 52 feet and 10 inches. The 150 yards backstroke for men's handicap was won by Joe Pang with J. Komenaka second and A. Moniz third.

GRAMMAR SCHOOL RELAY

Much cheering and excitement was caused by the 220 yards grammar school relay, won by Waiialua school with Lincoln second and Kalihi-waena third.

Lily May Bowmer, pardon, Lily Bowmer May, broke her own record when she won the 50 yards backstroke for women in 36 flat. The old mark was 36.2. Dorothy Waters took second and Janice Lovett won third.

The 220 men's breaststroke handicap was won by I. Fujiyama in 3.36 4-5. H. Vernon took second and T. Chang placed third. In the 50 yards for women, Lily Bowmer May again won honor. Her first place was won by nearly perfect diving and Leilehua Judd placed second with Dorothy Waters third.

Lily Bowmer May won another first in the 50 yards breaststroke for women in 42.2. W. Webster placed second and Dorothy Helenihi took third. The last event of the meet, 200 yards men's club relay, was won by the Outrigger Canoe Club after Hui Makani gave them a close fight. Central Y took third.
