

LILY BOWMER MAY IS BIG STAR OF SWIMMING MEET

Casa Del Mar Swimmer Carries Away Prize For Individual Honors

Lily Bowmer May and Cecily Cunha, members of the Club Casa Del Mar of Santa Monica, Cal., romped away with most of the laurels in the Uluhiu swimming meet held in Punahou tank Friday and Saturday evenings.

Largely through the "iron man" work of Mrs. May the mainland club carried away club honors. Mrs. May won the beautiful trophy donated by the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce for the swimmer making the most points. She scored five first places and one third for a total of 26 points.

The work of Mrs. May was the feature of the meet. She entered four events Saturday evening and won all of them, breaking the Hawaiian record for the 50-yard backstroke.

Two other Hawaiian marks also fell. Lum establishing a new record of 1 minute 6 1-5 seconds in the 100 yards freestyle for boys under 15, while Post set a new record of 2 minutes 34 4-5 seconds in the 220 yards service freestyle. The old mark in this 220-yard event was 2 minutes 49 seconds.

Won Swanzy Cup

Dorothy Waters carried away first honors in the feature events of the meet, the Swanzy cup competition. She scored 13 points in the competition. Lellehua Judd was second with 15 points. The competition includes five different events, the swimmer making the most points in these events being declared winner. The winner was decided in the final competition, Miss Waters barely nosing out Miss Judd in the 50 yards breaststroke event.

In the club competition the Uluhiu club was able to take second place, nosing out the Outrigger club 23-21. Only girls' events counted in this competition and the Outrigger club lost many points because Miss Waters swam untied.

Not As Thrilling

The races Saturday night did not prove to be as thrilling as those staged the first night of the meet. The closest race Saturday was the final event, the 200 yards men's club relay. This race was closely contested, with the winners of first three places finishing almost together. The Outrigger club team won the event.

Mrs. May started out Saturday night by winning first place in the 100 yards freestyle. She was followed by Miss Cunha. The winner's time was 1 minute 4 3-5 seconds. A few minutes later the mainland star swam the 50 yards backstroke in 35 seconds. Other events won by her the second night of the meet were the diving for women and the 50 yards breaststroke.

Miss Cunha, the other mainland star, did not win as many first places as her team mate but she
