Gay Harris Issues Call for

Local Aquatic Stars to
Prepare for Big
Meets

AS the first step towards preparing for the coming swimming meets in which mainland teams will compete against those from Hawaii, Gay Harris has issued a call for all persons interested in water polo to report to the Punahou pool tomorrow night at 7:30 o'clock for an organization meeting.

Harris asks that players from every club in the city who desire to try out for the Hawaiian team, be present Wednesday evening in order that a start may be made and practice hours arranged for the Hawaiian squad.

HARRIS IN CHARGE

Harris will assume charge of the water polo details, acting in cooperation with "Dad" Center, Harvey Chilton and other swimming officials, who will collaborate in rounding up the best aquatic talent in the territory for the Olympic club meet and the National championships for men.

"Sandy" Goodman, former Olympic club and West Point water polo star, will also turn out to lend a hand in picking the Hawaiian team. Whether Goodman will be eligible to play on the team is not known at the present writing.

Among those who will report for practice tomorrow night are members of the Outrigger, Hui Makani, Hui Nalu, Punahou and St. Louis water polo teams, representing the cream of the water polo talent available in the territory.
