the dare, and these three teams will fight it out again this evening. The time for the winning team last night was :59 flat.

Alexander and Baldwin took the next event, the 150 yards Bankers relay. Six men swam in each team, every man swimming 25 yards. The race was close up until the fourth lap, when the Alexander and Baldwin swimmer gained a lead which his teammates were able to hold to the finish. Bishop & Company finished second, with the First National Bank team a close third. The time for the event was 1:18 3-5. Members of the winning team were E. Vida, Lemon, J. Cruckshank, M. Chang, W. Aki, and H. Harrison.

ROSS SHOWS 'EM

Norman Ross, who has returned recently to Hawaii after his attempt to swim the Catalina channel gave an exhibition of the stroke used by him in that marathon swim. Norman Ross was the only entrant of that swim who did not use any form of grease.

Joe Pung, who performs in Honolulu harbor for incoming and departing boats, gave an exhibition of fancy high diving. This was the first time Pung had attempted to dive at night, and save for one rather severe flop, his feats were quite sensational. Pung did the swan dive, the one and a half, and attempted the two and a half, but was unsuccessful. Despite the severe shaking up he suffered from this dive, he was game to try another, and did the Hawaiian "Yambo."

OLYMPICS LOSE RELAY

The club relay, four men each swimming 50 yards, was one of the most exciting races of the entire evening. The Outrigger team took the lead from the start, and managed to hold it throughout, but it was nip and tuck during the entire 200 yards. The Olympics were not to be easily outdone, crowding the local swimmers throughout the race. In the last lap, the visitors began to cut down the lead gained by the Outriggers, but the advantage was too great, and the Olympics had to be contented with second place. The University of Hawaii took third place. Time for the race was 1:41 3-5.

The springboard diving was one of the best exhibitions of fancy diving to be staged at a local meet within the last few years. All contestants were good, and there were no "sloppy" dives to detract from the pleasure of the spectators. Makinney, Outrigger, won first place, while W. Lee of DeRussy took second and Sonnenburg of the Marines third.

WATER POLO GAME

As the climax of the first half of the meet, the Olympic club and the Outrigger Canoe club met in a water polo game. The visiting team has won considerable fame, and is considered one of the best in the country. They played a snappy brand of water polo, beating the local aggregation 8-3. At the opening of the contest the Outrigger players took the ball down the tank and it looked for a moment as though they would make the first score. But their shots did not pass the Olympic goalkeeper, and before anyone was aware of what had happened, the visitors had the ball down at the other end of the tank, where Christiansen shot a fast one for the first score.

GREAT TEAM PLAY

After a few skirmishes, and several futile shots at goal, the Olympics put another shot through the local defense man, Christiansen again making the score. The visitors showed superior team play, their long shots and subsequent recoveries for attempts at the goal were rather disastrous for the local team. The Outrigger players managed to take the ball within scoring distance, but seemed to have considerable difficulty in getting the ball past Colet, goalkeeper for the winged "O".

Lester Smith made the third successful shot for the Olympics, bringing the ball up from the center of the tank. The two teams fought back and forth for quite a while before Christiansen was able to slip another through the Outrigger men for the last goal of the first period. Score 4-0 in favor of the Olympics.

In the opening moments of the second half the local men showed considerable improvement, although Christiansen slipped another goal shot through. A timely rally and some good team work enabled the local men to finally score, Makinney making the initial goal. Gay Harris, Makinney and Goodman were the outstanding players for the local team, while nearly all of the visitors showed up well during the contest.

OLYMPICS PULL AWAY

Another goal by Christiansen gave the Olympics six tallies to one for the local boys. The play became faster than ever, with the Outriggers striving desperately to cut down the lead held by their rivals. Another score for the visitors, then Goodman charged down the tank and shot one home for his team. With but 20 seconds to go, Crabbe negotiated the third score for the home team.

The game ended with the score of 8-3 favoring the Olympics. Lineup of teams:
