

Outrigger Club's Play Trials Are Started Under Dad Center Buster Crabbe Shows the Way

Trials for the Outrigger Canoe club relay team were started yesterday afternoon at the Memorial pool, when "Dad" Center sent his charges through the initial sprint trial.

"Buster" Crabbe showed the way home in remarkably fast time with his brother Ed right in his wake. The fight for third, fourth and fifth places was a stiff one down to the touch with Newport out-touching May and the latter barely nosing

out Horace Sharpe.

The first OCC relay trial indicated that the Center clan is in the pink of condition for the big meet and that the local relay quartet will be the fastest to represent the islands since the halycon days of Duke Kahanamoku, Pua Kealoha, Warren and "Wild" Bill Harris.

Additional trials will be staged tomorrow afternoon and Saturday. Center said last night after which the veteran swim mentor will be in a position to select the team to swim against the Illinois A. C. and Japan squads led respectively by Johnny Weismuller and Katsuo Takaishi.

Rumors yesterday had it that efforts would be made to line Sam Kahanamoku up with the Outrigger club in which case he would be eligible to swim on the relay quartet. Kahanamoku is going great guns at the present writing and Center is confident that he is in shape to enter the Nationals.
