Kahanamoku, Crabbe Brothers, and Newport Survive The Trials

Swimmers Flock to Memorial Pool for Workouts; Argentine Star Takes First Plunge; Local Team Is Representative One

BUSTER CRABBE, Sam Kahanamoku, Billy Newport and Bud Crabbe survived the finals of the Outrigger Canoe club relay teams trials Saturday afternoon at the Memorial pool. The four premier OCC swimmers finished in the order named in the final 220-yard tryouts. They won their places on the Outrigger club relay team from a field of ten swimmers who were sent away from the start by "Dad" Center, Outrigger club coach.

Buster Crabbe and Kahanamoku finished the last 40 yards stroke for stroke and ended in what was declared a dead heat. Their time was 2:33, slow for the distance, but fair considering the fact that both men loafed going down. Newport and Bud Crabbe flashed out of the pack on the last 50 yards and made a gallant race of it to the finish line. Newport barely outouched the younger Crabbe.

PRATT FINISHES FIFTH

The surprise of the finals was the showing of Dudley Pratt, who finished fifth after leading the field for 150 yards. Pratt, who is a veteran swimmer and who once captained a Yale swimming team, appears to be in better shape than ever before but youth was served and his younger rivals for team berths won in the last gruelling sprints.

"I think this will determine who will represent the Outrigger Club in the relay in the National swimming championships," said Center following the trials Saturday.

Unless unforeseen developments take place, the two Crabbe boys, Kahanamoku and Newport will represent Hawaii in the National championships next week.

ZORILLA SHOWS UP

The Memorial pool presented a busy scene, scores of swimmers were working out all day, including Alberto Zorilla of the Argentine and the New York Athletic Club.

Zorilla swam 600 yards free style with Harry Glancy and finished off with a few easy laps both free style and backstroke.

Under the supervision of Center and Pratt, workmen were busy Saturday afternoon preparing the wires and

floats prior to marking the lanes in the beautiful pool. The lanes will probably be in position by Monday or Tuesday.
