

'DAD' CENTER TO CONDUCT SPECIAL SWIMMING CLASS

Proceeds From School Will
Be Turned Over To Olym-
pic Trials Fund

In response to repeated requests of swimmers, George "Dad" Center has consented to take charge of a 12-weeks course for swimming instructors, under the auspices of the recreation commission, according to announcement made by A. K. Powlison of the commission.

The course, open to men and women over 18 years, starts Thursday, March 29, at 8 p. m. and is to convene at the pavilion of the Outrigger Canoe club.

It is planned that multigraphed notes of every lesson will be made and that every member be presented with Sheffield's "Swimming Simplified," all of which will be included in the \$5 fee charged for the 12 weeks course. Any balance will be turned over to the fund to send Hawaiian swimmers to the Detroit Olympic trials.
