DISCUS TO MAR RECORD

With the exception of the discus throw, the Palama athletes should place in every event listed on the program, a noble satisfaction in itself. Should entries be placed as expected, the Pals will make a clean sweep in the 880-yard run, another unusual feat. In Kahoiwai, Harkins, Harrison and Nishihara the Settlement squad has a quartet that should outclass all competitors.

CERNEY TO STAR

Frank Cerney, diminutive "Schofield express," performing for the last time before a Honolulu audience before he takes off for the Olympic try-outs, should and will be the feature of the day. Cerney will run the mile and two-miles and can be depended upon to breast the tape before any of his rivals. In addition to Cerney, Schofield will have Hodgeson to figure in the distance runs.

GEORGE AGAIN

George Kahoiwai, erstwhile Kamehameha superlative performer, will provide a feast for the eyes of the most rabid fans when he tees-off in the quarter and half mile jaunts. Kahoiwai will have "Buzz" Smith, antiquated Buff and Blue dash artist to contend with. However, the Warrior flash should burn out the surfer entry in the early part of the event to come into the home stretch

in good enough time to be ready for anything. In the half mile run, George should again call his endurance to the fore and add another win to his credit.

THEY WILL MISS BUSTER

"Buster" McGuire, popular young star who will not perform Saturday, will not only be missed by his Outrigger team mates, but also by his many athletic admirers who have always enjoyed seeing the versatile Pun star in action. McGuire, without doubt, has thus far this year, carried an athletic program that has been nothing short of strenuous. "Duckfeet" carried the burden of attack in the Buff and Blue football campaign. As for track, nothing need be said other than that McGuire took part as the fans know what he has done.
